## Just love your work, it's all art

ARTISTS will explore the theme of love in an exhibition opening tomorrow night at Casuarina.

Nearly 30 local artists including Michelle Agius, Tania Summerell and Camilla Connolly have contributed pieces to the *Art of Love*, on display at the Casuarina Conference Centre until August 3.

The centrepiece of the exhibition will be a leadlight sculpture by Asaf Zakay (pictured) called the *Star of Merkeba*.

"The sculpture consists of two interlocked pyramids which represent man and woman in union and in perfect balance," he said.

Co-ordinator Cath Grant said the exhibition had been inspired by world events.

"Every time we turn on the news there seems to be something else to be concerned about," she said.

"We wanted to see how people express love in their chosen medium."

The exhibition is dedicated to Brisbane radio identity Brian Heathcote who was murdered in January. His sister, country singer Brenda Lee Heathcote, will perform at the opening.

Also featuring in the opening will be an address by Tweed Regional Gallery director Susi Muddiman, and a whip-cracking demonstration by 14-year-old artist Emma Clare.
